I use it in my third report to you to emphasize that our park has flourished and prospered for over 46 years because of the volunteer park directors, committee members, Circle Representatives, and many other volunteers who sacrifice their personal time on a year-round basis to ensure the continued smooth operation and financial soundness of our park.

It is unreasonable to expect that these dedicated volunteer members can satisfy the wants, desires, hopes, and aspirations of all 718 memberships, yet try they must, to identify what the majority want and deliver to their expectations.

I hope that the board you elected to act as your agents this past year has lived up to your expectations. During this time (along with staff), they have rebuilt the pool, expanded the Elm Commissary, improved the recycling process for members at the front of the park, replaced the laundry machines throughout the park, and replaced (or are in the process of replacing), two of our worn out maintenance vehicles.

They have also cleaned up our park’s financial records and recognized depreciation as a true operating expense of the park. Thereby ensuring that all that has been purchased this year, and for years to come, can be paid for from the park’s Long Range Planning Reserve which includes (thanks to our recognizing depreciation in our annual budgeting), financial contributions from those members who, over the years, made use of the park’s assets but sold their memberships before any of those assets needed replacing – ensuring they paid their fair dollar share of the wearing out of that park asset before leaving our park.

We have enjoyed our time serving on your behalf and look forward to our remaining two months in service to you.

Your park is now in need of five willing and capable members to run for your park’s board of directors this September. Will you step up to the challenge and provide the park’s membership with a choice of candidates from which to chose team players who can manage and affect change in line with the membership’s expectations?

Your Board, Nomination Committee Chair, Jim Miller (site 48-05) and Vice-Chair Jan Faulkner (site 47-07) encourage each of you to consult with your park friends and nominate some candidates.





# General Manager's Report

## July 2017

Hello Members,

Wow! July has reached us already. We have Canada Day and 4<sup>th</sup> of July celebrations coming. June was an average month around Birch Bay Leisure Park. We finally got some sunshine after one of the wettest winters in history! And we made it through with only minor flooding around the park! Now it's time to break out the sunscreen and shorts as the nice weather is upon us.

For you history buffs like myself, the following is an excerpt taken from history.com about the Canadian flag:

*The search for a new national flag that would better represent an independent Canada began in earnest in 1925 when a committee of the Privy Council began to investigate possible designs. Later, in 1946, a select parliamentary committee was appointed with a similar mandate and examined more than 2,600 submissions. Agreement on a new design was not reached, and it was not until the 1960s, with the centennial of Canadian self-rule approaching, that the Canadian Parliament intensified its efforts to choose a new flag.*

*In December 1964, Parliament voted to adopt a new design. Canada's national flag was to be red and white, the official colors of Canada as decided by King George V of Britain in 1921, with a stylized 11-point red maple leaf in its center. Queen Elizabeth II proclaimed February 15, 1965, as the day on which the new flag would be raised over Parliament Hill and adopted by all Canadians.*

*Today, Canada's red maple leaf flag is one of the most recognizable national flags in the world.*

And now the following on the American Flag taken from www.pbs.org:

*Between 1777 and 1960 Congress passed several acts that changed the shape, design and arrangement of the flag and allowed stars and stripes to be added to reflect the admission of each new state.*

*Today the flag consists of 13 horizontal stripes, seven red alternating with six white. The stripes represent the original 13 Colonies and the stars represent the 50 states of the Union. The colors of the flag are symbolic as well; red symbolizes hardiness and valor, white symbolizes purity and innocence, and blue represents vigilance, perseverance and justice.*

Now on to park business. We have an increasing problem throughout the park that I need all membership, as well as staff, to help out with - this being the brush bins and how they are being used. Let's quickly review what is accepted in the bins. We accept small amounts of brush - tied into bundles - and bagged grass clippings or green waste. That is all. We are finding anything from household waste to toilets and refrigerators, barbecues, doggy bags, tires, and other non-brush bin items. The lack of complying with how they are used is wasting money (that can be better used elsewhere), labor hours, and disrupts the aesthetics of the park. Abuse of a brush bin can even carry a fine. Please read the back page of this newsletter for full instructions on how to properly use your brush bins.

Please have a safe holiday. Watch out for errant fireworks on the beach and watch out for each other during this busy Birch Bay celebration. Please remember to wear your Rec Tags during this, the busiest weekend of the summer. It helps security staff identify members as they come in and out of the front gate. Thank you.

## Rules and Regulations Report, July 2017

As we move into the high summer season I think it is time for some gentle reminders of a few of the Rules and Regulations that govern Birch Bay Leisure Park and why it is such a fabulous place to be!

**GOLF CARTS:** These are governed by Section D. Safety Within the Park which states that EVERY vehicle that is self-propelled is considered a “motor vehicle. The only exception to this is a power wheelchair when operated by the owner for its intended purpose. Golf cart owners should review the entire Section D of the rules paying special attention to the following.

### Section 1 Motor Vehicles.

- a) The speed limit within Birch Bay Leisure Park is five (5) miles per hour (eight (8) km/h) for all motor vehicles.
- b) Use of motor vehicles within the Park by unlicensed drivers is prohibited. (*This means that a child CANNOT drive your Golf Cart*)

The fines for violations of this Section of the Rules are detailed in the current version of the Rules and Regulations which are available in the park office or on the BBLP Website.

Recently there was an incident where a child was driving a child’s motorised “car” without adequate supervision and while doing so ran into a staff member’s car that was parked in the area surrounding Briar Centre. It was impossible to identify the child as they were not wearing a Rec Tag and the parent immediately ran up and removed the child. Unfortunately, now the staff member must claim on insurance to have repairs made to their car as the parent refused to stop and identify themselves. It is incumbent upon parents to adequately supervise their children and all children in the park should wear Rec Tags for safety reasons if no other.

In closing I would add that if anyone has constructive changes to the rules that they wish to have considered by the board please put them in writing and leave in the office for the staff to pass on to me. It would be appreciated if you have suggestions that you also propose solutions as well.

I hope that everyone enjoys their summer in the park. If we are all aware of the rules and follow them the park will be a much happier place in which to be.



## DIY CHALK POPS

**Materials:** Plaster of Paris, tempura paint (neon works best), silicone pop mold, wood craft sticks, plastic cups and plastic spoons. You'll also need cold water, scissors and measuring cups (not pictured). I was able to find all these supplies at Walmart.

A few important notes before we begin:

- 1. Do not put Plaster of Paris down your drain!** It will harden in your pipes and cause damage. We are using disposable cups and spoons for this reason. You can rinse very small amounts off your measuring cups and such, but get the majority of the excess (wet or dry) in the trashcan.
- 2.** This can be messy. I would recommend doing it outside and using larger plastic cups than I did!
- 3.** Cold water means between 40-50° F. Yes, it matters. Chill enough water in your fridge for 30 minutes prior to starting.  
--Tempura paint is egg-based and non-toxic, but Plaster of Paris should not be ingested. Older children may help with the mixing, but little ones probably shouldn't.
- 4.** The following measurements were enough for my specific **Wilton Brownie Pop Mold**. You may have to adjust your volumes for different silicone molds. Begin by cutting down your craft sticks to about 3" long.

You will need one plastic cup for each color you wish to make. Since my mold has eight spaces, I decided to mix eight different colors. Fill each plastic cup with 1/3 cup cold water.

Add 2 Tablespoons of tempura paint to each plastic cup. I measured the first one then just eyeballed the rest. Since my paint set only had six colors, I created the purple (pink + blue) and aqua (green + blue) myself.

Use your plastic spoons to gently stir the water and paint together. Don't worry if it remains a little chunky or separated—it will smooth out in the next step.

Add 2/3 cup Plaster of Paris to each plastic cup. This is where it got messy and I learned my cups were a little too small.

Stir until thoroughly combined. Ideally, your mixture will have the consistency of thin yogurt.

Carefully pour your colors into the silicone mold. Gently tap the mold on your work surface to release any air bubbles.

After two minutes, the plaster will begin to firm up. Insert your craft sticks (cut side down) into the middle of the chalk "pops." They should be easy to place without having to push hard or hold them up.

Setting these out in the hot sun is a great way to cure them quickly. After an hour, you will be able to carefully remove them from the mold. Leave them in the sun to continue drying.

Most sources recommend waiting 24 hours for the plaster to fully cure. This will ensure a nice solid chalking experience. But I'm not most sources. Are you kidding me? My kids saw these chalk "pops" baking in the sun all afternoon, and it was all I could do to keep their hands off of them. I finally relented after 4 hours of dry time. At that point the chalk was still a little "damp" but firm, and it didn't crumble one bit.

The wood sticks made it easy for little hands to hold the "pops" without scraping their knuckles on the sidewalk and the colors are more vibrant than any store bought chalk we've ever owned.


These DIY sidewalk chalk "pops" are a fun activity guaranteed to fill up at least a few hours of that endless summer daylight. They would be excellent party favors or gifts for summer birthday kids, too. And while they look good enough to eat, please no licking!





Use colored chalk to make a bull's eye on the ground and then toss in wet sponges to rack up points. You can play to a set numbers of points or play best two out of three, or three out of five!

Make chalk dress up "dolls" and decorate them with old kids clothes! Lay out the clothes neatly on the ground and let your child draw in their doll's head, arms and legs.



## Treasurer/Finance Report – July 2017

By now you should have received and paid your 2<sup>nd</sup> assessment which was due June 30, 2017. If you did not receive one, please contact the office to get a copy and to confirm your mailing address - members need not be reminded that they are required to ensure their mailing address is kept current with the office.

Unfortunately, history shows that there will be some 25 – 30 members that will have missed the June 30<sup>th</sup> deadline so staff will spend numerous hours in the coming months doing collections. ☹ If you did miss the deadline, please make every effort to make your payment as soon as possible to minimize late payment fees.

With our facilities infrastructures ranging in ages of a few years old to just over 45 years old the long range planning committee is in the process of assessing current and future needs within the Park. Once their initial assessment is complete, the Finance Committee will review and comment accordingly. It will be a busy next couple of months while the process is worked through so the Board and ultimately the membership are brought up to date on next steps.

Now that the real busy season is upon us, members might want to keep in mind there are three main categories of people in the park:

Members – only those people whose names are on the membership certificate

Invited guests – those in the Park as invited by a member and therefore whose actions are the responsibility of the member

Staff – those hired to perform specific duties on behalf of the Association and its members

Why mention this? Well let's start with a couple of examples of vandalism which, as members, we all end up paying for. Are you aware that within a day or two of the pool opening this year a light fixture, yes one that had just been newly installed, was forcibly removed from the socket in the pool? Costs for staff time, electrician, and parts were incurred. At some point in time most members have probably seen graffiti/carving of names in park property. Costs for staff time and material to remove/replace are incurred. Another reason for mentioning this is that when garbage, brush, and recyclables are dumped in the wrong disposal area, or cardboard boxes are not broken down flat, we incur costs for staff time and additional volume haul fee are incurred. The list goes on.

So remember, as members we are obviously responsible for our own actions but also always responsible for the actions of our invited guests (e.g. children, relatives, friends, etc.). Let's work together to try to reduce the unnecessary resources often being spent/utilized. Sometimes the challenges can be traced back to the lack of direct member supervision or perhaps a member just not knowing what is required. When in doubt, please ask the office or a staff person that may be out working in the area or even your fellow member. History shows there is always willingness to help – just ask for clarification! ☺






# SECURITY REPORT - JULY 2017

Our patience has paid off and the beautiful summer weather the Pacific Northwest is known for has arrived. And just in time for both the 150<sup>th</sup> Canada Day celebrations and the American Fourth of July weekend.

Leisure Park is anticipating a possible record setting number of visitors during this first weekend of July. We'd like to remind everyone that membership holders are responsible for the behavior and actions of their guests and visitors. And yes, this does include contractors and service people. Be sure to mention this to your guests before they arrive to make sure they are familiar with our Park's rules. The speed limit, especially, will be strictly enforced over the holiday weekend.

The speed limit in Leisure Park is 5 miles per hour. Not 10, not 20, but 5 miles an hour. To give you an idea of what that should be like, the average adult human walks at approximately 3 miles per hour. We expect all wheeled modes of transportation to adhere to this limit, including golf carts, bicycles and any motorized scooters or kid's motorized toy vehicles.

Children from 0 to age 15 years of age must be under the immediate supervision of a parent or guardian when operating a motorized toy vehicle. Just last month a youngster came around a corner in a motorized toy car and smacked straight into the corner of a full sized parked vehicle. The little one escaped without injury, but this is the exact type of situation that we are trying to guard against when we ask that parents stay close to their children.

Another thing to keep in mind; quiet time in Leisure Park begins at midnight. This rule remains in effect even over the holiday weekend. Please turn down your stereos and try to be aware of the volume of noise being produced from your site. Try to be considerate of your neighbors.

Lastly, I want to remind everyone that there are NO FIREWORKS OF ANY KIND allowed in Leisure Park. No poppers, no crackers, no roman candles, no sparklers, no flash-bangs, no smoke-bombs, no lanterns. Absolutely no fireworks inside the park. If you, or someone registered to your site, are found to be setting off fireworks, you will receive an immediate fine. Take your fireworks out to the beach.

# FROM THE ADMINISTRATION CENTER

## **Propane Tanks**

We fill your small propane tank at the Admin Center. Located between the recycling bins and the dirt is the propane filling station. Tanks left on the "EMPTY" side by 4:00 PM will be ready for pick up by 4:30 PM and placed on the "FULL" side. Please be sure that your tank is clearly marked with your site number and last name for easy identification.

## **Topsoil & Gravel**

We offer 4-way topsoil, crushed limestone or chipped rock for purchase at the Administration Office. You may purchase these commodities by 5 gallon bucket or wheelbarrow full (you fill). We keep a limited supply of these materials on hand, so if you need more than a yard or two we will be happy to put you in touch with a wholesale supplier.

## **Brush Bins**

Each bath house has a fenced area for small loads of yard waste ONLY. All yard waste should be bagged or bundled for easy removal by park staff. Compost bags are available at the office, five for \$2.00.

## **Garbage**

Please place bagged household garbage in the dumpsters located at the bath houses and at the front of the park. To dispose of larger items (carpet, mattresses,

furniture, etc.) stop by the office to purchase a \$20 dump permit.

## **Recycling**

Please recycle. Aluminum cans (preferably crushed) go in the recycling shed. Newspapers, mixed paper, cans and jars go in bins in front of the shed at the front. Please flatten plastic jugs. Cardboard goes in the bin inside the recycling shed at the front. Please flatten. Additional recycling locations are: Bathhouse #3, #4, #5, #6, #7, #8, #9, #10 – Brier Center and Elm Center. Further details about recycling are available at the Administration Office.

## **Laundry**

Bathhouses 3, 4, 8, & 9 have coin operated washers and dryers. (\$2.00 US to wash and \$2.00 US to dry) **Machines take U.S. QUARTERS ONLY.**

## **Utilities**

We respond to your water, power and sewer problems. If it's a park problem we fix it. If not, we can point you towards a solution. Please be aware of the delicate disposition of our sewer system. Sewage is pumped out of the park and our pumps choke on the smallest of things; a dish rag, that messy diaper (even a supposedly disposable diaper), a potted plant with its roots, a knife, etc. When these things reach the pump, it plugs. We then have to hire a contractor to go down into the

sewer tank to make repairs, costing the park time and money.

## **Compressed Air**

Outside the Maintenance Shop door we provide compressed air for your tires.

## **Construction / Maintenance Permits**

All construction requires a permit. Permit applications are available at the Administration Center and only take a moment to fill out. Office staff are also on hand to assist with the process.

## **Mail & Parcels**

Please stop by the Administration Center to pick up your mail and parcels to make room for more.

## **Volunteers**

Birch Bay Leisure Park is always looking for volunteers to help out with our Park events. If you are interested in lending a hand, come by the Office and sign up!
