Activities are starting once again at the Park and both the young and the not so young (a group I am proud to be a member of) are back to enjoying what the Park is really meant to be, a place to relax, have fun, meet new friends and enjoy the things we all work so hard to achieve.

There is a schedule of events on the last page of this newsletter so you can keep it as a reminder of all the activities that are taking place at the Park. If you have not been to some of the events please check them out, stop by to see what is going on, you may meet a new friend.

The pool is open and as the most used facility in the Park it is always a sure sign that summer has begun. Please adhere to the pool rules as they are meant to ensure we have a safe and clean environment to enjoy.

We had a relatively small turnout for the Townhall Meeting, which I trust is not a sign of apathy but one of general agreement that the Park is in good shape and providing everyone with what they want. There was a big round of applause for Don Brown and his staff who manage the administration of the Park along with staff who maintain the Park making sure things look good and are in working order. Of special note, Ruth Brown was commended for the great job she is doing looking after the gardens and flower beds – thanks Ruth.

As I mentioned in my report in the May newsletter, you will notice that road repairs have begun and we expect them to be completed before the end of June so as not to disrupt people when the Park is at its busiest in July and August. This is part of a three-phase plan to maintain the roads. Doing these surface repairs now reduces the need for more major road reconstruction and keeps our costs down.

At the Townhall Meeting the members approved of a plan to engage a design consultant to prepare a set of plans for the refurbishing of the bathrooms at the Elm Centre. There is a consensus that the bathrooms do not meet the needs of how Elm is being used. Once we have the plans we will be able to get quotes on the work required to do the upgrade. This work will be scheduled later in the year so it does not affect activities that are scheduled.

If you own a golf cart please make sure it is registered at the office and you have your site number clearly displayed on the cart. There is a possibility in the future, that golf carts will be allowed on designated roads in Birch Bay. If this becomes a reality please make sure you obtain a copy of all the rules that apply and you have the appropriate insurance. The Park has not taken a position on this initiative so it is up to each individual to follow the rules as set by the County.

We are always looking for people to help with any of the activities at the Park. If you have never volunteered give it a try, it is amazing how much fun it can be. Just helping the activity organizer with a few extra hands makes all the difference.

So, how did we do in 2017?

A copy of the 2017 financial statements will be provided to the members as part of the AGM package and will include both the 2017 and 2016 comparative figures. At this time last year we had prepared a breakeven budget and at year's end we had a net operating income of \sim \$25,000 (\sim \$35 per member). Why the \$25,000 variance? We saw overall revenues \sim \$10,000 higher than budgeted

(primarily interest related) and overall operational costs ~\$15,000 lower than budgeted.

One key document that has not been updated since late 2015 is the summary of excess funds and their use. The update will be completed in the coming months and be reported to the membership at the first opportunity.

Assessment Notices

On May 19th, the Board approved the upcoming assessments which are payable by June 29th. The 2nd 2018 Assessment has been set at \$880.00 to balance the budget. At this level, and presuming there are no unexpected events, we anticipate we will come close to a breakeven position for the year. It should be noted that dues collected represent approximately 94% of the operational funds anticipated to be raised in 2018.

On May 25th and 26th, members were sent emails containing links to various standard assessment notices, one of which was the summary of the revised budget (May 26th email). We have noted on the summary that there is a discrepancy between what was reported as 2016 actuals in November 2017 vs in the current summary. The discrepancy is due to an error in including revenues from the Entertainment Fund in the operational summary.

The individualized 2nd Assessment Notices were emailed to members between May 25th and May 28th. If you happen to be one of the members that have not provided an email address to the office, your assessment was mailed on May 28th so you should be in receipt of it no later than June 8th. As usual, the notice included your basic assessment, your November 2017 to April 2018 electrical billing, and any other outstanding amounts for items such as, but not limited to, propane, dirt, gravel, parcels, etc. If you had an amount on account that reduced the amount otherwise payable it was also reflected in what was sent. If in doubt, please, please, please contact the office to confirm what is owed.

Regardless of your chosen payment type, please make sure you include both your site # and your surname when making the payment. This is especially important when using a location other than the Blaine Store, and even more so when the bank is located outside Whatcom County. If you are making payment by cash, please take the additional step of contacting our office to let them know the amount paid and date.

If you have not already received your Assessment Notice by email, please contact the office and confirm we have the correct email address. If your Assessment Notice had to be mailed, you too should contact the office if you have not received it yet and confirm your correct mailing address. Your ultimate goal and responsibility is to determine what amount must be deposited to our UMPQUA bank account before closing on June 29, 2018.

This report is certainly in the Good News Category!

First of all, The Golf Cart Zone project has been passed and is a GO - I've attached a copy of the report outlining details & guidelines from The Birch Bay Chamber Of Commerce on Page 12 of this Newsletter! According to Bill Brown (Chamber President), it will take effect in approx. 2 weeks (most probably week of June 4^{th}) once they get signs posted, etc.!



Please read the document carefully and be fully aware of what modifications to our golf carts need to be made (ie - seats belts, rear view mirrors, etc.), what driver qualifications need to be met (ie - 16 yrs. old, registered license, etc.) & what rules of the road must be adhered to - which are all outlined in the document!

Also keep in mind that a number of people who opposed the "yes" vote will try to have the entire project rescinded and as such will be monitoring infractions.....SO.... please abide by the rules!

I would also recommend that each of us should review our existing insurance policies - ie: if we need to do anything such as obtaining additional Insurance before venturing out onto a Public Road.

Secondly, also in the good news category is the BBWarm/Whatcom County (flooding project) which is continuing to move forward. Without going into a lot of detail, you will see Whatcom County Engineers and BBWarm personnel in the Park conducting assessment surveys.

On July 21st. our Office will be registering Golf Carts (a mandatory requirement of the Park) and as such will be setting up at Circle 17 from Noon til 2pm. Members that have not registered their golf carts should come with visible Site Numbers on both front & rear of Carts and working headlights & taillights (if used after dark). Please keep in mind that Don, our Park Manager, and our Office Staff are making it as easy as possible for member registration!

The New Birch Bay Drive Golf Cart Zone Regulations:

RCW 46.08.175

Golf cart zones.

(1) The legislative authority of a city or county may by ordinance or resolution create a golf cart zone, for the purposes of permitting the incidental operation of golf carts, as defined in RCW <u>46.04.1945</u>, upon a street or highway of this state having a speed limit of twenty-five miles per hour or less.

(2) Every person operating a golf cart as authorized under this section is granted all rights and is subject to all duties applicable to the driver of a vehicle under chapter <u>46.61</u> RCW.

(3) Every person operating a golf cart as authorized under this section must be at least sixteen years of age and must have completed a driver education course or have previous experience driving as a licensed driver.

(4) A person who has a revoked license under RCW <u>46.20.285</u> may not operate a golf cart as authorized under this section.

(5) The legislative authority of a city or county may prohibit any person from operating a golf cart as authorized under this section at any time from a half hour after sunset to a half hour before sunrise.

(6) The legislative authority of a city or county may require a decal or other identifying device to be displayed on golf carts authorized on the streets and highways of this state under this section. The city or county may charge a fee for the decal or other identifying device.

(7) The legislative authority of a city or county may prohibit the operation of golf carts in designated bicycle lanes that are within a golf cart zone.

(8) Golf carts must be equipped with reflectors, seat belts, and rearview mirrors when operated upon streets and highways as authorized under this section.

(9) A city or county that creates a golf cart zone under this section must clearly identify the zone by placing signage at the beginning and end of the golf cart zone on a street or road that is part of the golf cart zone. The signage must be in compliance with the department of transportation's manual on uniform traffic control devices for streets and highways.

(10) Accidents that involve golf carts operated upon streets and highways as authorized under this section must be recorded and tracked in compliance with chapter $\underline{46.52}$ RCW. The accident report must indicate that a golf cart operating within a golf cart zone is involved in the accident.

Do you need to register your Golf Cart?

Leisure Park requires that all Golf Carts must be registered with the Administration Office before being used inside of Leisure Park.

If you still need to register your Golf Cart, bring it to the ACADIA SIDE of the CIRCLE 17 FIELD on July 21st between 12 Noon and 2 PM and have your Golf Cart registered with Birch Bay Leisure Park.

In order to register your Golf Cart, it must meet these requirements:

- Golf Carts must be equipped with working head lights and tail lights (if they will be used after dark)
- Golf Carts must be displaying a Birch Bay Leisure Park Decal • (Decals will be available for purchase at the Event. \$1.00 USD)
- Golf Carts must legibly display their Site Number
- Legible Serial or VIN Number

Registration only takes a few minutes, so if you haven't yet gotten around to doing so, now is the time to register your Golf Cart!





FROM THE ADMINISTRATION CENTER

Propane Tanks

We fill your small propane tank at the Admin Center. Located between the recycling bins and the dirt is the propane filling station. Tanks left on the "EMPTY" side by 4:00 PM will be ready for pick up by 4:30 PM and placed on the "FULL" side. Please be sure that your tank is clearly marked with your site number and last name for easy identification.

Topsoil & Gravel

We offer 4-way topsoil, crushed limestone or chipped rock for purchase at the Administration Office. You may purchase these commodities by 5 gallon bucket or wheelbarrow full (you fill). We keep a limited supply of these materials on hand, so if you need more than a yard or two we will be happy to put you in touch with a wholesale supplier.

Brush Bins

Each bath house has a fenced area for small loads of yard waste ONLY. All yard waste should be bagged or bundled for easy removal by park staff. Compost bags are available at the office, five for \$2.00.

Garbage

Please place bagged household garbage in the dumpsters located at the bath houses and at the front of the park. To dispose of larger items (carpet, mattresses, furniture, etc.) stop by the office to purchase a \$20 dump permit.

Recycling

Please recycle. Aluminum cans (preferably crushed) go in the recycling shed. Newspapers, mixed paper, cans and jars go in bins in front of the shed at the front. Please flatten plastic jugs. Cardboard goes in the bin inside the recycling shed at the front. Please flatten. Additional recycling locations are: Bathhouse #3, #4, #5, #6, #7, #8, #9, #10 - Brier Center and Elm Center. Further details about recycling are available at the Administration Office.

Laundry

Bathhouses 3, 4, 8, & 9 have coin operated washers and dryers. (\$2.00 US to wash and \$2.00 US to dry) Machines take U.S. QUARTERS ONLY.

Utilities

We respond to your water, power and sewer problems. If it's a park problem we fix it. If not, we can point you towards a solution. Please be aware of the delicate disposition of our sewer system. Sewage is pumped out of the park and our pumps choke on the smallest of things; a dish rag, that messy diaper (even a supposedly disposable diaper), a potted plant with its roots, a knife, etc. When these things reach the pump, it plugs. We then have to hire a contractor to go down into the sewer tank to make repairs, costing the park time and money.

Compressed Air

Outside the Maintenance Shop door we provide compressed air for your tires.

Construction / Maintenance Permits

All construction requires a permit. Permit applications are available at the Administration Center and only take a moment to fill out. Office staff are also on hand to assist with the process.

Mail & Parcels

Please stop by the Administration Center to pick up your mail and parcels to make room for more.

Volunteers

Birch Bay Leisure Park is always looking for volunteers to help out with our Park events. If you are interested in lending a hand, come by the Office and sign up!

The Administration Office would like to remind everyone to please check on your account balance the next time you are at the office.


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
