My key point for this report is to remind everyone of the AGM meeting on Sunday Sept 2. You will be receiving notification of the meeting in early August. Please make every effort to attend as this is another one of your opportunities to have your voice heard in the management of the Park. There will be elections for three Directors, each for a 2 year term.

The Long Range Planning Committee is drafting a 5 year plan for the replacement or upgrade to aging infrastructure, solutions for the drainage and flooding issues at the Park and the possible relocation of the maintenance building to the recycling area up the hill by the dump.


We are getting close to our 50th birthday and we all know that with time comes the need to replace or upgrade major facilities before the costs to fix them becomes prohibitive. The idea behind the 5 year plan is to review it each year and keep adding a 5th year to the plan so that there is always a vision for the Park to follow. By setting up plans that future Boards can follow we will be completing the work on our schedule and not in the case of emergencies.

As always, if you have ideas please let us know by contacting the office so that we can get them on to our monthly meeting agendas for discussion.

Good news and a big thank you! Only 22 members missed the June 30^{th} payment deadline – you may recall that in the July newsletter I noted that history shows there will be some 25 - 30 members that will have missed the deadline. So the new process of sending the semi-annual assessment notices by email does not have any apparent problems. The office staff are thankful to

the handful of members that took the initiative and contacted the office in June as they had not received their notices and knew there was a payment deadline of June 30th.

Working with the office staff, we sent out various overdue notifications to members in early July which included notification that their gate cards would be deactivated effective August 1st unless payment is received in full.

Members that have not paid by July 31st will again be notified by letter that further penalties have been assessed and these sorts of notifications will continue until all funds owing are paid in full or the membership is revoked. These are not pleasant tasks, but are necessary to ensure accounts are kept up-to-date and to ensure members are eligible to vote at the AGM. Some members are surprised at the AGM when they are told they are not able to vote since the Association's By-law 1f) states:

Only members in good standing shall be eligible to hold office or entitled to vote at any general or special meeting. Members who have assessments or charges that have remained unpaid for 60 days shall not be considered to be in good standing unless such charges are under appeal and the appeal has been delivered in writing to the Board of Directors at least 30 days before an election, special meeting, or general meeting.

So we encourage you to ensure you make the appropriate arrangements to pay your outstanding amount(s).

We would like to take this opportunity to also remind members that if they have made other purchases such as propane, gravel, etc. and have not been by the office to pay for it, please do so as soon as possible. The number of members regularly using the Park drops off significantly after Labour Day and we'd like to have these things cleaned up as soon as possible. If you are unsure if you have a balance owing, please contact the office as they are more than happy to let you know. Remember, these smaller purchase amounts can be paid directly at the office!

So, how did we do in 2017?

A copy of the 2017 financial statements are included in the AGM package sent to members by email (if you have not received yours, please contact the office). The statements include both the 2017 unaudited and 2016 audited comparative figures for general operations (e.g. we have not included amounts related to the Entertainment Funds: 2017 surplus of \$5,135; 2016 surplus of \$4,886). When reviewing the statements please remember that the notes included are to assist the reader in evaluating the statements.

When budgeting to determine the annual assessments, we try to prepare a breakeven budget based on historical data, trends, anticipated projects, and any other known economic factor at the time. Our surplus for 2017 was \$24,479 vs a \$79,554 loss in 2016.

More will be reported on the 2017 figures and how we are doing come the AGM and September Newsletter.

Members either stuck in and got the job done or they have made arrangements with staff and the board to have their sites brought into compliance over time.

We will now move forward and attempt to visit sites with unregistered golf carts and leave the relevant forms for the members. It is a simple process. If you have any questions, please check with the office staff. You can also find the Golf Cart rules detailed in the BBLP Rules and Regulations document in SECTION D. SAFETY WITHIN THE PARK Parts 1 and 3. The entire document is available on the BBLP website or you can pick up a printed copy from the office.

Once again thanks to everyone for keeping our park so beautiful and making it a safe and enjoyable place to be.


This event required a lot of volunteers to pull it off successfully. Great job - the positive feedback has been amazing. Specific volunteer recognition goes to:







FROM THE ADMINISTRATION CENTER

Propane Tanks

We fill your small propane tank at the Admin Center. Located between the recycling bins and the dirt is the propane filling station. Tanks left on the "EMPTY" side by 4:00 PM will be ready for pick up by 4:30 PM and placed on the "FULL" side. Please be sure that your tank is clearly marked with your site number and last name for easy identification.

Topsoil & Gravel

We offer 4-way topsoil, crushed limestone or chipped rock for purchase at the Administration Office. You may purchase these commodities by 5 gallon bucket or wheelbarrow full (you fill). We keep a limited supply of these materials on hand, so if you need more than a yard or two we will be happy to put you in touch with a wholesale supplier.

Brush Bins

Each bath house has a fenced area for small loads of yard waste ONLY. All yard waste should be bagged or bundled for easy removal by park staff. Compost bags are available at the office, five for \$2.00.

Garbage

Please place bagged household garbage in the dumpsters located at the bath houses and at the front of the park. To dispose of larger items (carpet, mattresses,

furniture, etc.) stop by the office to purchase a \$20 dump permit.

Recycling

Please recycle. Aluminum cans (preferably crushed) go in the recycling shed. Newspapers, mixed paper, cans and jars go in bins in front of the shed at the front. Please flatten plastic jugs. Cardboard goes in the bin inside the recycling shed at the front. Please flatten. Additional recycling locations are: Bathhouse #3, #4, #5, #6, #7, #8, #9, #10 - Brier Center and Elm Center. Further details about recycling available at the Administration Office.

Laundry

Bathhouses 3, 4, 8, & 9 have coin operated washers and dryers. (\$2.00 US to wash and \$2.00 US to dry) Machines take U.S. QUARTERS ONLY.

Utilities

We respond to your water, power and sewer problems. If it's a park problem we fix it. If not, we can point you towards a solution. Please be aware of the delicate disposition of our sewer system. Sewage is pumped out of the park and our pumps choke on the smallest of things; a dish rag, that messy diaper (even a supposedly disposable diaper), a potted plant with its roots, a knife, etc. When these things reach the pump, it plugs. We then have to hire a contractor to go down into the

sewer tank to make repairs, costing the park time and money.

Compressed Air

Outside the Maintenance Shop door we provide compressed air for your tires.

Construction / Maintenance Permits

All construction requires a permit. Permit applications are available at the Administration Center and only take a moment to fill out. Office staff are also on hand to assist with the process.

Mail & Parcels

Please stop by the Administration Center to pick up your mail and parcels to make room for more.

Volunteers

Birch Bay Leisure Park is always looking for volunteers to help out with our Park events. If you are interested in lending a hand, come by the Office and sign up!


