Treasurer/Finance Report – July 2018

As you may recall, at the 2017 AGM members adopted a motion to allow for the semi-annual assessments to be sent out by email rather than the more costly and slower postal system. The office staff worked diligently to have things ready for the 2nd 2018 assessment and emails were initiated on May 25th and 26th. Generally speaking the process appears to have gone smoothly with only a few members having to proactively contact the office as they had not received their information and it was now June. Staff immediately provided the member(s) with the required information so their payment could be made in time – no later than June 29, 2018.

We remain appreciative of the ~96% of the membership that regularly pay their assessments on time and in full. History shows that there will be some 25 – 30 members that will have missed the deadline so staff will spend numerous hours in the coming months doing collections. Many members would not be aware that each month that a member has an outstanding balance we correspond in writing with the member so we have documentation of our collection efforts. If you did miss the deadline, please make every effort to make your payment as soon as possible to minimize late payment assessments. When in doubt, reach out to our office staff, they are more than happy to provide you with details of amounts owing, payment options, etc.

Knowing that the emailing system worked without any major hiccup, the next package you will receive by email is the AGM package. Much of the Board's attention in July will be finalizing the AGM package which will include the 2017 financial statements for your consideration. Please look for this package in late July, and again, if for some reason you do not receive it please reach out to the office staff that will make every effort to get you the package.

With all that goes on in the park, we need to socialize and work together to try to mutually enjoy our park and the company of others. For me, a helpful guideline I use when forming a position on an issue brought before the board and/or when attempting to be neighbourly to other members, invited guests, and staff is there are three categories of people in the park at any time:

Members – only those whose names are on the membership certificate

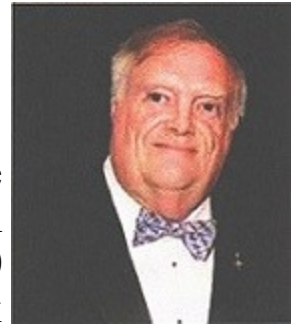
Invited guests – those in the Park as invited by a member and therefore whose actions are the responsibility of the member

Staff – those hired to perform specific duties on behalf of the Association and its members

With the implementation of the Birch Bay Golf Cart zone the Board of Directors has scheduled a “Golf Cart Registration Update Session” on July 21st at Circle 17 from noon until 2:00 pm. To this end the rules regarding Golf Cart use in the park have been updated. This update includes the “Special Golf Cart” Rules that were listed on the reverse of the registration form. The updated rule was sent in an email blast to all members in late June. Please remember the following;

All Golf Carts must be registered through the park office and clearly display the members site number.

The 5-mph speed limit in the park applies to all modes of transport **including** bikes, scooters and golf carts.

Unlicensed drivers are not permitted to operate Golf Carts.

All persons must be seated while the golf cart is in operation and a seat for all passengers is required.

As we move into the busy Summer season our “Crown Jewel” the swimming pool will be the most used facility in the park. It is imperative that all persons using the pool take a cleansing shower prior to swimming. Please follow the rules that are clearly posted at the pool. They are there for your safety and to comply with Whatcom County regulations. Remember the word of the Pool Attendant is final.

If at anytime you have questions or concerns, please contact me through the park office. I will endeavour to reply with all due speed or to take your questions to the board for an answer.

The big event which kicks off our summer is the Fireworks Display along The Beach. Please keep in mind, the lighting of fireworks in the Park is NOT ALLOWED as per our Rules & Regulations for obvious reasons - Section D. Point 6! Our Security Staff will be on high alert so please exercise good common sense - no lighting of fireworks in the Park would avoid fines.

If your are going to the Beach to watch the Fireworks Display, please be extremely careful crossing the road because of heavy traffic and congestion - last year there was an incident involving a pedestrian.

Your Board, as always is extremely busy as you'll see in the Board minutes and Director reports in Our Newsletter so please take a couple of minutes and have a look. Information is also available on our Website!

A couple of additional items I should mention:

1. Recently, we had a mishap with human injury in the Park with a lady falling off her bike, so Don and your Board are working on updating our Emergency Protocol which will be published in our next Newsletter - in the meantime, please make a note of Emergency Phone Numbers displayed on our Electronic Read-A-Board at the entrance to the Park just inside our front gate - separate numbers for Canadians and U.S. members. Also, our office has complimentary refrigerator magnets available - stop by and pick one up if you don't already have one.
2. Our Stormwater /Flooding Project continues to move forward with insertion of Elevation Outlet Pipes as we look at out-fall levels. In layman terms, in cooperation with BBWarm , we need to determine if water can flow unobstructed from points to the Ocean (out of the Park). We're trying to establish where we may need to dig, if necessary.

We've also formed a Stormwater/Flooding Committee and are looking for any volunteers with Engineering Backgrounds to sit on our Committee. It's a big project and we could use and would value your contribution - please register at our office. Thanks!

As always, I'd like to thank Newsletter volunteers Maureen Siddall and Jennifer Timmreck for all their help in putting this Newsletter together!

The Glen is an aging park as well (1 year younger than BBLP) and is facing many similar issues in maintaining and replacing an aging infrastructure. They too have a long range planning process to deal with the timing and financing of replacing and maintaining assets.

The Glen faces similar challenges with rising costs of recycling and waste disposal and how best to manage these issues. Effective communication with members is a challenge with the Glen as well.

We have committed to continue sharing ideas and experience and the Glen has offered to host a meeting in the fall with our two Boards and General Managers.

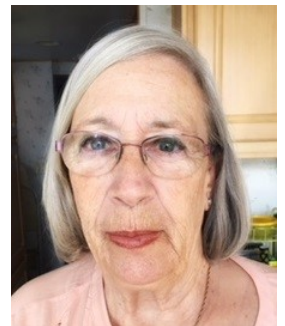

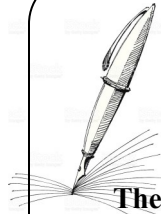

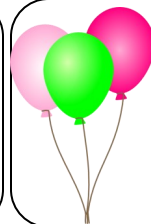

HOW TO PREPARE FOR A MEDICAL EMERGENCY

If you are like most people, the thought of experiencing a medical emergency is scary, but small steps can alleviate stress and help improve care. Here is a list of the following ways you can prepare for a medical emergency:

Take a CPR/First Aid class

In an emergency, every second counts. Attending a CPR/First Aid Class helps ensure you can provide aid before an ambulance arrives. North Whatcom Fire & Rescue provides free classes each month. More information can be found on our website: nwfrs.net/resources/classes.

Have a Clearly Visible Address

Regardless of the type of emergency, ensuring the house/building numbers are clearly visible day and night, from both directions, helps responders find you quickly.

Use high contrast or reflective numbers (minimum of 4 inches tall for residential, 6 inches for commercial).

Ensure obstructions like shrubs or vehicles do not reduce visibility.

If your home is not visible, an address post must be placed at the main road. One local option for purchasing a reflective marker is at safetyhomeaddress.com.

Keep a Medical Information Sheet

During an emergency, medical providers may ask a lot of questions. Often patients tell us, "My information is on file at the hospital." Unfortunately, EMTs and paramedics do not have access to this information when we get to your home. Maintaining a medical information sheet is one of the best ways to ensure we can deliver the best possible care. At a minimum, include the following: full name, birthdate, allergies, prescription medications, (including doses and schedules), chronic conditions (diabetes, high blood pressure, heart disease, etc.), reasons for prior hospitalizations, doctor's name and emergency contacts.

Have a Plan

If you are calling an ambulance on behalf of someone else, you can help emergency crews by preparing for the ambulance arrival; lock up dogs or other pets, turn on the porch light, ensure the patient's personal medical information is available, and move furniture out of the way to allow for a gurney.

Do you need to register your Golf Cart?

Leisure Park requires that all Golf Carts must be registered with the Administration Office before being used inside of Leisure Park.

If you still need to register your Golf Cart, bring it to the ACADIA SIDE of the CIRCLE 17 FIELD on July 21st between 12 Noon and 2 PM and have your Golf Cart registered with Birch Bay Leisure Park.

In order to register your Golf Cart, it must meet these requirements:

- **Golf Carts must be equipped with working head lights and tail lights (if they will be used after dark)**
- **Golf Carts must be displaying a Birch Bay Leisure Park Decal on the Front of the vehicle**
 - *(Decals will be available for purchase at the Event. \$1.00 USD)*
- **Golf Carts must legibly display their Site Number on the Front and Rear of the vehicle**
- **Legible Serial or VIN Number**

Registration only takes a few minutes, so if you haven't yet gotten around to doing so, now is the time to register your Golf Cart!

Birch Bay Leisure Park Garbage

The article below was first published in 2014 and is still very relevant today. Are you aware that BBLP spent over \$25,000 in 2016 on garbage removal? In 2017 this was reduced to slightly over \$23,000. I'm sure we can do better and it is up to us all to assist in reducing these costs for the park. So, read the article below and chip in to reduce garbage costs.

Garbage is my Pet Peeve. As a result of various recycling initiatives, we have saved \$10,000 to \$15,000 per year. However, it is clear that we could be saving much more. Some members are very good at recycling, accepting our guidance and putting waste in the right bins. Others aren't so good and don't recycle at all. While too many make some effort not realizing that it is a wasted effort. Putting tins, aluminum cans and paper in one bag and putting it near the bins without sorting does nobody any good. During the busy period of July and August 4 man-days per week of staff time are dedicated to cleaning up our mess and sorting recycling where possible. But where it takes too much time {and money} to sort recycling is tossed into the regular garbage. What a waste! Members need to be better since we are leaving another \$10,000 to \$15,000 on the table. Do your share - please sort your garbage and crush your cans.

Your Board would rather not motivate members by introducing fines. Your Board would rather not spend a lot of money with expensive garbage solutions like garbage compactors or personal recycling bins. Your Board would rather not install security cameras. But we do need to clean up our mess and reduce costs.

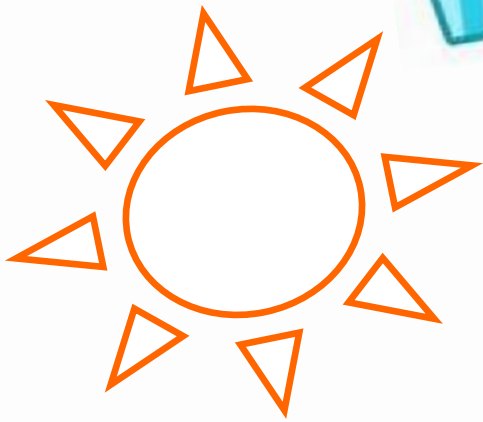
We have begun by taking some steps to improve appearances as you can now see at the main garbage space at the front of the Park. We have hidden the containers (and sometimes the mess) behind fencing.

In order to improve the cardboard bin and its related mess a slot will be installed in the bin so that the only way that cardboard can be put in the bin is that the cardboard must be flattened first. Hopefully this measure will encourage people to do it right! We don't want to introduce much more expensive strategies. Please do your share.

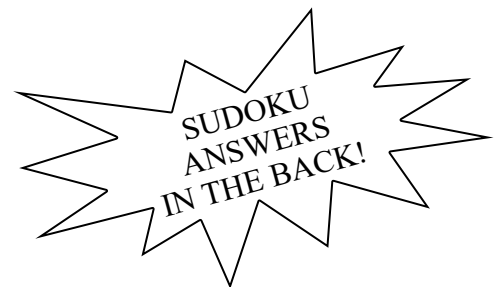

FROM THE ADMINISTRATION CENTER

Propane Tanks

We fill your small propane tank at the Admin Center. Located between the recycling bins and the dirt is the propane filling station. Tanks left on the "EMPTY" side by 4:00 PM will be ready for pick up by 4:30 PM and placed on the "FULL" side. Please be sure that your tank is clearly marked with your site number and last name for easy identification.

Topsoil & Gravel

We offer 4-way topsoil, crushed limestone or chipped rock for purchase at the Administration Office. You may purchase these commodities by 5 gallon bucket or wheelbarrow full (you fill). We keep a limited supply of these materials on hand, so if you need more than a yard or two we will be happy to put you in touch with a wholesale supplier.

Brush Bins

Each bath house has a fenced area for small loads of yard waste ONLY. All yard waste should be bagged or bundled for easy removal by park staff. Compost bags are available at the office, five for \$2.00.

Garbage

Please place bagged household garbage in the dumpsters located at the bath houses and at the front of the park. To dispose of larger items (carpet, mattresses,

furniture, etc.) stop by the office to purchase a \$20 dump permit.

Recycling

Please recycle. Aluminum cans (preferably crushed) go in the recycling shed. Newspapers, mixed paper, cans and jars go in bins in front of the shed at the front. Please flatten plastic jugs. Cardboard goes in the bin inside the recycling shed at the front. Please flatten. Additional recycling locations are: Bathhouse #3, #4, #5, #6, #7, #8, #9, #10 – Brier Center and Elm Center. Further details about recycling are available at the Administration Office.

Laundry

Bathhouses 3, 4, 8, & 9 have coin operated washers and dryers. (\$2.00 US to wash and \$2.00 US to dry) **Machines take U.S. QUARTERS ONLY.**

Utilities

We respond to your water, power and sewer problems. If it's a park problem we fix it. If not, we can point you towards a solution. Please be aware of the delicate disposition of our sewer system. Sewage is pumped out of the park and our pumps choke on the smallest of things; a dish rag, that messy diaper (even a supposedly disposable diaper), a potted plant with its roots, a knife, etc. When these things reach the pump, it plugs. We then have to hire a contractor to go down into the

sewer tank to make repairs, costing the park time and money.

Compressed Air

Outside the Maintenance Shop door we provide compressed air for your tires.

Construction / Maintenance Permits

All construction requires a permit. Permit applications are available at the Administration Center and only take a moment to fill out. Office staff are also on hand to assist with the process.

Mail & Parcels

Please stop by the Administration Center to pick up your mail and parcels to make room for more.

Volunteers

Birch Bay Leisure Park is always looking for volunteers to help out with our Park events. If you are interested in lending a hand, come by the Office and sign up!

The Administration Office would like to remind everyone to please check on your account balance the next time you are at the office.

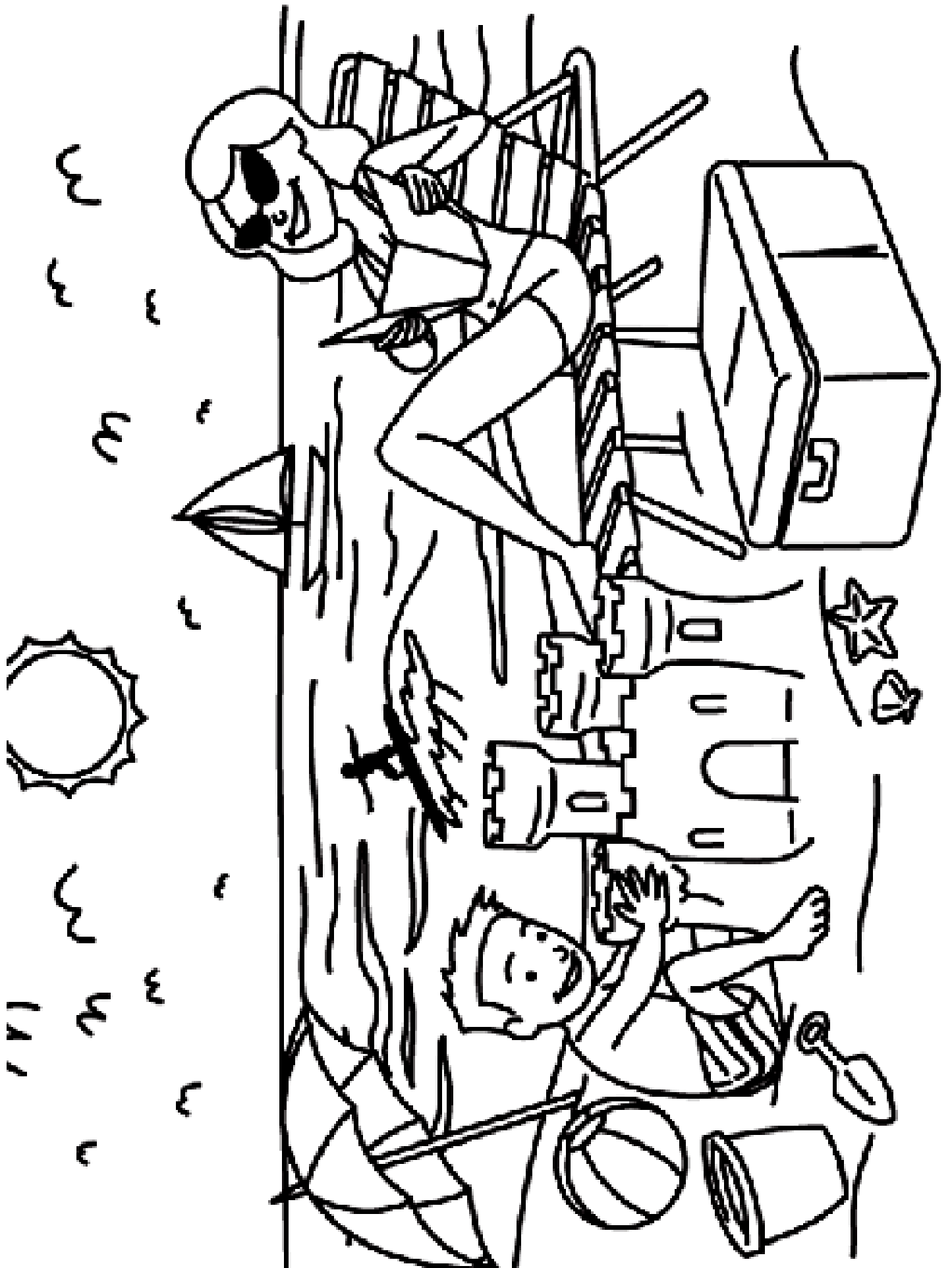
