It is hard to believe that summer has come to an end. Let's hope for a nice long warm autumn just to extend our use of the Park. From what I have been told by the members a lot of fun was had this year due to all the activities in the Park. Thank you to all the volunteers, you make the Park a great place to come to for adults, teenagers and kids.

I would like to thank Tom Collins for his year on the Board. Tom has been instrumental in working with the office staff on revamping the newsletter, dealing with public relations within the Birch Bay community and working with our General Manager, Don Brown, on the BBWARM initiatives. Tom has agreed to remain active on the BBWARM drainage and flooding plans to keep continuity in the Park's work with them. Thank you, Tom.

I am pleased to be able to remain on the Board for another two years. It is my way of giving back to the Park and helping to build a solid administrative base to support future Boards and to work with the Long Range Planning Committee in setting budgets for projects needed to keep the Park's infrastructure and assets in good working condition.

This past year has been a busy one for your Board. We meet once a month to deal with regular administrative items and any issues that are brought to the Board from the Circle Representatives or from individual members. Minutes of the meetings are posted within seven days of our Board meetings, so all members are aware of the topics of discussion and decisions that the Board has taken. Please remember, if you have any questions or concerns you can contact the Board through the Circle Reps or the office and the Board will respond.

At the recent Meet the Candidates session, a key topic of discussion was the amount of people speeding in the Park. This has been an issue that the Board has been trying deal with during the year. More fines have been given out this summer than in previous years and it does not seem to stop the speeding. It will be an item for the new Board to address. We want the Park to be a safe place for all of us and especially the kids so PLEASE keep to the speed limit.

At last, the final 2018 Newsletter submission deadline has arrived – my apologies for submitting this a few days late!

Comments on our 2017 financial results:

The Balance Sheet shows the figures are fairly consistent from one year to the next. The \$41,301 increase in Building / Land Improvements was due to final costs of the pool relining and tiling project, the Brier renovation project, and the bocce bistro project spilling over from 2016 into 2017, as well as the Elm storage project and the recycling station project both of which were started and completed in 2017, and costs incurred to date related to the sink hole repair. The \$19,915 increase in Furniture/Equipment/Software/Vehicles was for the purchase of the F450 boom truck and gate software upgrade. The Accounts Payable and Accruals balance of \$33,638, a decrease of \$18,591 over the prior year, only includes regular operating payables and does not have audit and tax return costs as was the case in the 2016.

In 2017 the Park's revenues were \$1,284,477, which is up 7.3% or \$87,097 from the previous year, and our operating expenditures, including depreciation, were \$1,275,568, which is down \$32,282 OR 2.5% from the previous year. When also taking into account other income and expenses and we incurred and overall surplus of \$24,479 (vs 2016 deficit of \$79,554). Looking at the Statement of Revenue and Expenses, you'll note that many line items stayed relatively the same as in the previous year. Looking specifically at those lines with variance of \$10,000 or more, please note:

MEMBERSHIP ASSESSMENTS – up \$83,842: Board went back to what one might call the traditional method of determining the semi-annual assessments in which depreciation costs are included.

OFFICE EXPENSE – down \$12,748: due in large part to one time security and general administrative purchases in 2016 not duplicated in 2017 as well as consistent coding of computer/network vendor costs to professional fees.

PROFESSIONAL FEES – decrease \$42,959: computer/network vendor costs were correctly allocated to professional fees in 2017 as well as we were able to significantly reduce costs in this area as we changed outside accounting services, legal issues were resolved, and we did not incur the costs of an audit for 2017.

PROPERTY TAXES – increased \$11,228: amount is set by government and in part is determined by land use.

MISC INCOME/DONATIONS – decreased almost \$20,000: 2016 amounts were related to donations and purchases for the Brier project (eg. fitness equipment donation, furnishing and other equipment purchases).

Where we are at through July 31, 2018:

Our income statement showed a deficit of about \$46,400. The two main expense categories where unbudgeted expenses have been incurred are auto/vehicle expenses and sewer repairs:

- The auto/vehicle expenses are related to the cylinder repair for the F-450 boom truck and the king-pin replacement on the flatbed dump truck.
- As you can appreciate any necessary sewer repairs are completed as a priority. We have had to do repairs to a lift station, some sewer side repairs, and work on the dogwood pump station.

We are also noting an upward trend in utility cost which included sewage, water and power. We are reviewing and monitoring these costs to ensure we have a better understanding of the current drivers so when setting the 2019 budget we are more accurate in our projections.

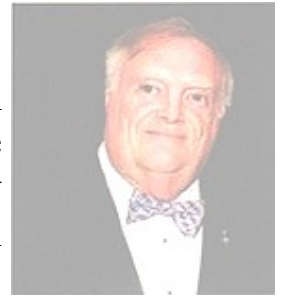
Outstanding Balances reminder:

We ask that if you have purchased anything in the past few months that you confirm with the office that your account is paid up – these smaller purchases can be paid directly at the office. If you are unsure if you have a balance owing, please contact the office as they are more than happy to let you know.

Syd Hughes - Rules & Regulations, BBLP Board of Directors



As we wind down the summer and move into the fall season I wish to thank all the members who have diligently followed the rules and regulations of the Park. You have made it a very enjoyable place to be. Please remember that just because we are in September the rules still apply to one and all.

With the onset of some recent rains the weeds that have laid dormant in driveways and garden beds are sure to take on new growth. If you keep ahead of them they will be much less work to clear out and you will not take the chance of a fine being imposed for not keeping your site in good repair.

I also wish to stress that the speed limit in the park is 5 mph for all vehicles. This includes Bikes, Golf Carts and Electric Scooters as well as cars, etc. Speeding has been a problem all summer long in the park and it is something that the board of directors plans to address moving forward. It has been suggested by some park members that we institute a zero-tolerance policy for speeders and proceed directly to issuing fines rather than warning members and their guests.

Golf Cart owners should also be aware that you must be in possession of a valid driver's licence to operate these vehicles in the park. Children are not allowed to drive Golf Carts even under parental supervision. Also, if driving your Golf Cart at night in the park it is required to have operating lights that are turned on.

All members that have Golf Carts that are not registered with the park office have been contacted and asked to register them prior to September 1st. In future any unregistered Golf Carts will be stopped, and a violation fine issued so please register your Golf Cart. If you are unsure of the procedure or think that you are registered and received a notice requesting, you to register and think that you have already complied with this requirement please contact the office, so we can further search the files. A couple of people have already done so and this has helped us update our site records.

Once again Thank you for your co-operation in following the rules of the park. If at anytime you have a question please do not hesitate to contact me through the park office.

Having just completed my 1 yr. term on the Board, I've made the decision this will be my last and will not be running again in order to spend more time with the family!

As I reflect back on this past year and the success of this Board in administering to Our Park, I have to ask myself if we are now in a better position at the end of this year than we were last year.

Every member of this Park should be asking themselves this same question. My answer is unquestionably "YES". We are very fortunate to have a Board that listens, manages professionally and has a look to the future which I might add is a bright one! This report is really an update to last months report:

1. We continue to work closely with BBWARM in resolving our flooding issue. During this past month we have finalized our study of measuring invert elevations of outfall pipes/drains in determining if drain pipes are actually draining into our drain ditch around the park, through the tidal gate and into the Ocean. You'll be hearing more on this as we progress along our path of resolution. Once the report is finalized it will be submitted to BBWARM for review.

We've also determined through the insertion of cameras into the Drain Pipe that runs from the Tidal Gate to the Ocean that The Pipe needs repairing - both Park and BBWARM are determining the best approach to fixing the issue!

As I've stated in previous reports, our partnership with BBWARM is a solid one with a mutual goal of resolving our flooding issue. As an aside, I've been asked by the Board to stay involved with the Project and am more than happy to do so.

2. I am also happy to announce that the underground fiber optic lines have now been installed and sometime this month, Comcast will be upgrading the Park to the new system resulting in increased internet speeds, better resolution, and less frequent problems.

3. As far as Community Relations is concerned, we are once again members of the Chamber Of Commerce and have been trying to step up our presence within the Birch Bay Community - our involvement in the Discovery Day Parade is just one of those activities.

4. We hope everyone has enjoyed our Newsletter as we've tried to make it easier to read and little more appealing to all Members.

In closing, I'd like to thank all Park Members, Don Brown & his Park/Office Staff and our Park Board for a great interesting, & fulfilling year. Also to specifically thank Jennifer Timmreck, Shelly, Betty & Maureen Siddall for all your help with this Newsletter.

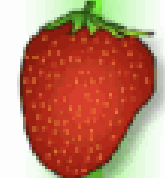
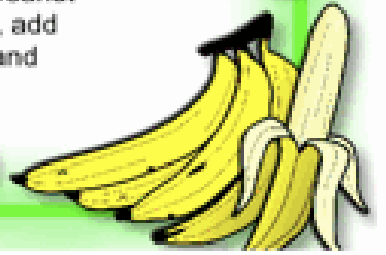
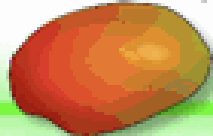
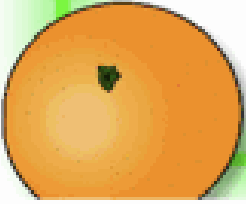
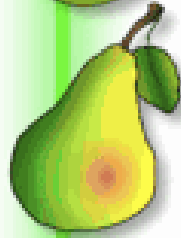
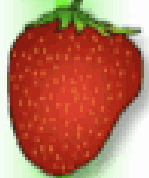
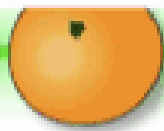
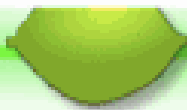
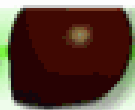
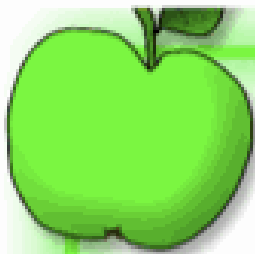


TIPS AND TRICKS TO MAKE BACK TO SCHOOL TIME EASY FOR EVERYONE:

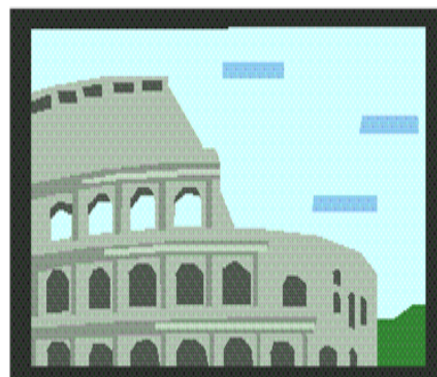

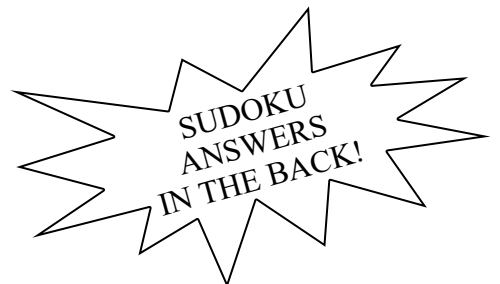

FROM THE ADMINISTRATION CENTER

Propane Tanks

We fill your small propane tank at the Admin Center. Located between the recycling bins and the dirt is the propane filling station. Tanks left on the "EMPTY" side by 4:00 PM will be ready for pick up by 4:30 PM and placed on the "FULL" side. Please be sure that your tank is clearly marked with your site number and last name for easy identification.

Topsoil & Gravel

We offer 4-way topsoil, crushed limestone or chipped rock for purchase at the Administration Office. You may purchase these commodities by 5 gallon bucket or wheelbarrow full (you fill). We keep a limited supply of these materials on hand, so if you need more than a yard or two we will be happy to put you in touch with a wholesale supplier.

Brush Bins

Each bath house has a fenced area for small loads of yard waste ONLY. All yard waste should be bagged or bundled for easy removal by park staff. Compost bags are available at the office, five for \$2.00.

Garbage

Please place bagged household garbage in the dumpsters located at the bath houses and at the front of the park. To dispose of larger items (carpet, mattresses,

furniture, etc.) stop by the office to purchase a \$20 dump permit.

Recycling

Please recycle. Aluminum cans (preferably crushed) go in the recycling shed. Newspapers, mixed paper, cans and jars go in bins in front of the shed at the front. Please flatten plastic jugs. Cardboard goes in the bin inside the recycling shed at the front. Please flatten. Additional recycling locations are: Bathhouse #3, #4, #5, #6, #7, #8, #9, #10 – Brier Center and Elm Center. Further details about recycling are available at the Administration Office.

Laundry

Bathhouses 3, 4, 8, & 9 have coin operated washers and dryers. (\$2.00 US to wash and \$2.00 US to dry) **Machines take U.S. QUARTERS ONLY.**

Utilities

We respond to your water, power and sewer problems. If it's a park problem we fix it. If not, we can point you towards a solution. Please be aware of the delicate disposition of our sewer system. Sewage is pumped out of the park and our pumps choke on the smallest of things; a dish rag, that messy diaper (even a supposedly disposable diaper), a potted plant with its roots, a knife, etc. When these things reach the pump, it plugs. We then have to hire a contractor to go down into the

sewer tank to make repairs, costing the park time and money.

Compressed Air

Outside the Maintenance Shop door we provide compressed air for your tires.

Construction / Maintenance Permits

All construction requires a permit. Permit applications are available at the Administration Center and only take a moment to fill out. Office staff are also on hand to assist with the process.

Mail & Parcels

Please stop by the Administration Center to pick up your mail and parcels to make room for more.

Volunteers

Birch Bay Leisure Park is always looking for volunteers to help out with our Park events. If you are interested in lending a hand, come by the Office and sign up!

The Administration Office would like to remind everyone to please check on your account balance the next time you are at the office.
