From the Whatcom County Fire Marshal's Office

Date and times for Fireworks Discharge:

- July 3rd: 6pm until 11pm
- July 4th: 6pm until MIDNIGHT
- July 5th: 6pm until 11pm

What Fireworks are legal?

Consumer fireworks sold at a Washington State Licensed and Whatcom County Permitted stand are allowed to be used in the county. The Washington State Patrol has a <u>list of legal and illegal fireworks</u> and a document about the <u>difference</u> <u>between legal and illegal explosive devices</u> on their website.

Legal Tribal Land Fireworks

Firecrackers, bottle rockets, missiles, and rockets are legal to possess and discharge on tribal lands ONLY. These items are illegal in Washington State and become illegal fireworks when possessed off tribal lands.

Illegal Fireworks and Improvised Explosive Devices M-80's and larger,

dynamite and any improvised, homemade or altered explosive devices such as tennis balls or cherry bombs are illegal explosive devices. Persons in possession or using illegal explosive devices can be charged with a felony.

What about sky lanterns? Sky lanterns are NOT a firework, but are regulated by State and County fire code. Sky lanterns are only allowed to be lit as long as they are tethered (i.e. kite string, twine, etc.) and controlled at all times. They must remain tethered until they are extinguished and then should be retrieved for proper disposal. Lighting a sky lantern un-tethered can be charged criminally through the Fire Code and as a Reckless Burning if any fire is started due to their use.

PER THE BY-LAW, RULES AND REGULATIONS, ALL FIREWORKS ARE PROHIBITED ON PARK PROPERTY. Citations will be issued for first offence.

Watermelon Lemonade

Prep Time: 35 Min

Serves: 8


What you will need:

- 1 large or 2 small watermelons
- 250 ml lemon juice
- 100 g golden super fine (caster) sugar
- 1 liter bottled soda water
- 1 lime, cut into slices
- Small handful mint
- Crushed ice

How to make your refreshment:

- 1. Cut the top off the watermelon and hollow it out using a large spoon, fishing out any seeds along the way.
- 2. Mash the flesh through a cheese cloth into a bowl. Put the flesh in a blender (or use a tall jug and hand blender) with the lemon juice and sugar, blend to a purée.
- 3. Stir in the soda.
- 4. Heap some ice into the hollowed-out watermelon and fill it with the lemonade mixture.

Serve the rest in a jug with the lime slices and mint. Have a bowl of extra crushed ice on the side so people can help themselves.

Please be respectful of the community and haul out anything you bring to the beach. Quiet hours are between 12:00 Midnight and 8 am. (See Section E: Neighborliness Number 3. Noise on page 22 of the By-laws, Rules, and Regulations.)


PLEASE REMEMBER TO WATCH YOUR SPEED!


